Council Meeting was called to order at 4:30 P.M. by Mayor Hendrickson.

- Roll Call Roll Call of Councilmembers showed the following members present:

- Consent Calendar The consent calendar includes items which require formal Council action, but which are typically routine or not of great controversy. - It was moved by Councilmember Hubbard and seconded by Councilmember Kunz to approve the items listed on the consent calendar. This received unanimous approval.
- Stop Sign At 4th West 2nd South The need for a stop sign on the corner of 4th West and 2nd South was discussed by the Council. On South, 4th West, there is currently only one stop sign between 8th South and Oneida Street, at 4th South. Councilmember Thomas has observed that people speed through that residential area, and recommended the Council consider adding stop signs at 2nd South on 4th West.
- It was moved by Councilmember Thomas and seconded by Councilmember Hubbard to add stop signs at the intersection of 4th West and 2nd South. This received unanimous approval.
- County Commission Report County Commissioner, Scott Workman, requested money from Preston City to assist the Franklin County Soil and Water Conservation District in their efforts to eradicate the threat of Quagga Mussels, by using checkpoint stations, which will allow boats on the county lakes and reservoirs.
- It was moved by Councilmember Thomas and seconded by Councilmember Kunz to provide a one-time \$3,000 donation to the Franklin County Soil and Water Conservation District, to assist with their Quagga Mussel prevention program. This received unanimous approval.
