Councilmember Larson stated that there is an error in the November 5<sup>th</sup> Minutes, in that he voted against the sale of the Cub River Water Shares. After the correction to the Minutes, it was moved by Councilmember Larson and seconded by Councilmember Thomas to approve all items on the Consent Calendar, including corrected Minutes of November 5, 2018, Bills through November 26, 2018, and the Treasurer's Monthly Report dated October 31, 2018. ## Commission Report

Franklin County Commissioner, Robert Swainston, asked for verification for DEQ that the sewer dumping project at the landfill is done. Public Works Director, John Balls verified that the project is complete.

Commissioner Swainston also asked, if the County provided the lights and poles, would the city cover the power charges to light the area of the Archery Building where the recycle bins are now located. Council agreed that this is a good idea to have the lighting and agreed to cover the costs of the power.

Water/Sewer Rates Proposal

The Council discussed the proposed water and sewer rate increase. Three town meetings were set for January 10, 2019 11:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m., January 14, 2019 6:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m., and January 23, 2019 6:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m.

#111 Nondiscrimination Clerk Acock presented Resolution #111, a resolution regarding nondiscrimination on the basis of disability. It was moved by Councilmember Larson and seconded by Councilmember Thomas to adopt Resolution #111, regarding nondiscrimination on the basis of disability, and to authorize Mayor Beckstead to sign said Resolution. Resolution #113 Declare Surplus Property 64 Shares Cub River Water

Attorney Olson presented Resolution #113, declaring sixty-four (64) shares of Preston City owned Cub River Water Shares as surplus property, and asked that a public hearing be set and a notice for public auction. The minimum bid per share is set at four thousand dollars (\$4,000.) per share, with a minimum of 2 shares per purchase, and the shares sold, "as is".

It was moved by Councilmember Thomas and seconded by Councilmember Wall to adopt Resolution #113, a Resolution Declaring Certain Real Property Owned by the City of Preston, Consisting of 64 Shares of Stock in Cub River Irrigation Company, to set a public hearing on January 28, 2019, and to set a public auction following the January 28, 2019 meeting. It is also moved that the notice include wording to notify potential bidders that the stock shall be sold, "as is" and subject to the irrigation company by-laws.
